UNIFORM DRESS CODE *Grades Gan Aleph through 4*

Effective 2006-07 school year

Required Clothing – Boys and Girls

1. ***Polo Shirts*** (Short or Long Sleeved) mesh or interlock with the Beth Tfiloh Dahan Community School Logo in a variety of approved colors are available through Lands' End. At least one polo shirt must be white for special events. White and light blue polo shirts are available through a supplier in Israel and can be ordered through www.blueandwhitekids.com.
2. ***Turtlenecks, mock turtles, sweatshirts, sweaters and jackets*** in a variety of approved colors with the school logo are available through Lands' End. Sweatshirts are available through www.blueandwhitekids.com.
3. ***Oxford or chambray shirts and blouses*** with the school logo are available in a variety of approved colors through Lands' End.
4. ***Khaki, navy or black chino or corduroy pants***, pleated, tailored, plain-front or elastic waist available at a supplier of your choice. A pocket on the side is acceptable if it is tailored and not obtrusive.
5. ***Knee length khaki, navy or black jumpers, skirts, skorts, or longer length shorts*** (shorts only may be worn during the months of August, September, October, April, May and June) available at a supplier of your choice.
6. ***Socks or tights*** (solid color navy or white) must be worn with shoes.

Unacceptable Clothing

1. Nylon or denim fabric.
2. Embellishments of any kind.
3. Sweatpants, balloon pants, nylon pants or short shorts.
4. Clothing with holes, fraying, patches or clothing that is excessively tight or baggy.
5. Excessive or dangling jewelry should not be worn for safety reasons.
6. Flip flops.

Addendum

Students are expected to stay well within the intent of the dress code. Any student who violates the dress code or repeatedly tests its limits will be subject to disciplinary action.

It will not be necessary for Lower School students to change for Physical Education. Clothing and athletic shoes that are durable enough for the playground are also more than adequate for Physical Education. All students must wear athletic shoes for Physical Education.

On holidays such as Purim or specially designated occasions, the dress code may be lifted and students may be permitted to wear casual or "specialty" clothing. Parents will be notified in advance of these occasions.

PARENTS AND GUESTS ARE ASKED TO DRESS IN A MANNER BEFITTING A JEWISH DAY SCHOOL WHEN THEY ENTER THE BUILDING.

Field Trips

During the school year students will go on field trips away from the campus which enhance the instructional program. Students are expected to dress in the Beth Tfiloh School Uniform, unless otherwise directed by the teacher, and behave in an appropriate manner. Boys are expected to wear Kippot. Money is not necessary as all expenses are normally covered by the school. If the trip extends over the lunch hour, students will be asked to bring a bag lunch which must be dairy. **Parental chaperones are asked to conform to the dress policies and Kashruth policy of the school while accompanying students on trips.**
